Life Inside Juvenile Prisons explores teen violence, conflict resolution, and behavioral choices and consequences. Substance abuse, self awareness/self esteem, tolerance and critical thinking and decision making are related themes.

The objective of the video and questionnaire is to provide an inside look at life behind bars, to demonstrate there is nothing glamorous or enjoyable about spending time in prison, to reveal the painful consequences for victims' families and emphasizes that for many crimes, there is no way to undo the wrong. This video is also used to encourage teen offenders to reevaluate their attitudes and their lives- and change them for the better.
